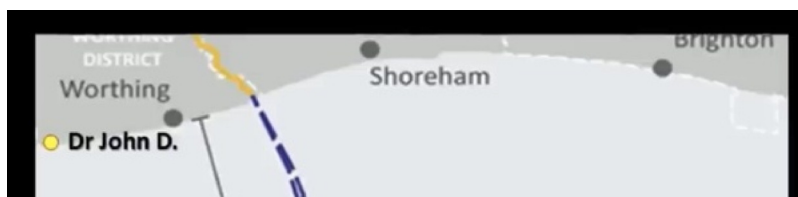

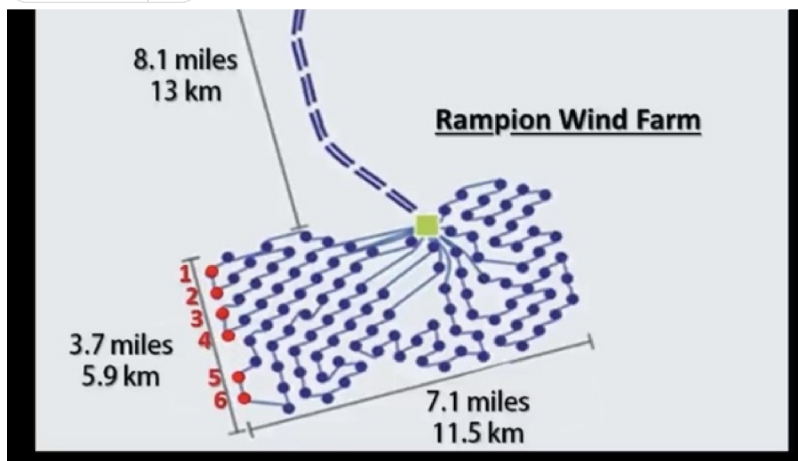

That is the kind of "evidence presentation" one is up against when it comes to the shape of earth, so here one more evidence that flat out disproves the globe theory simply by being factual:

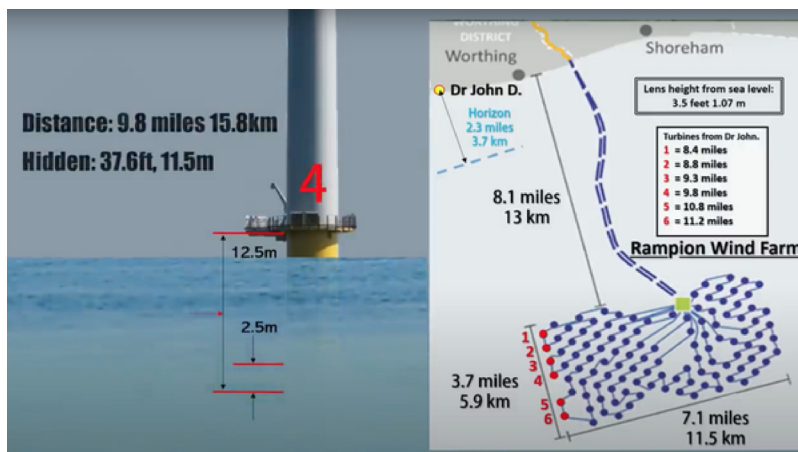
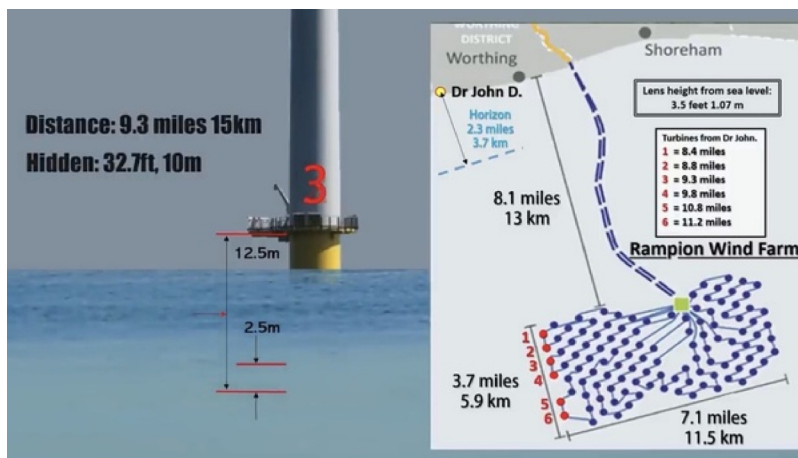
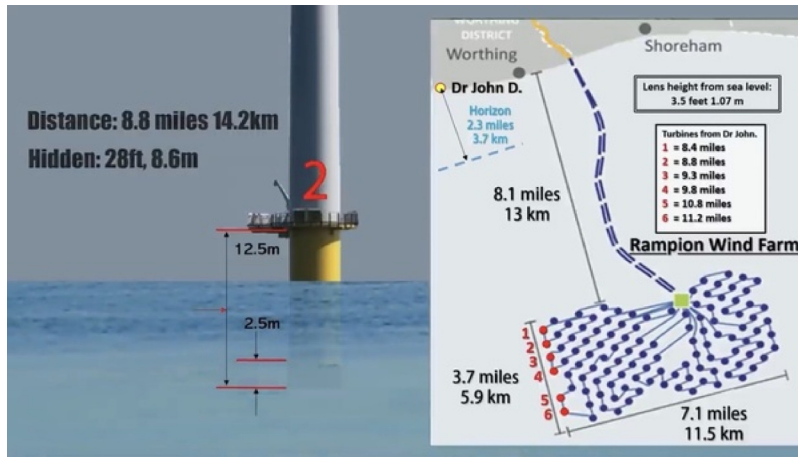
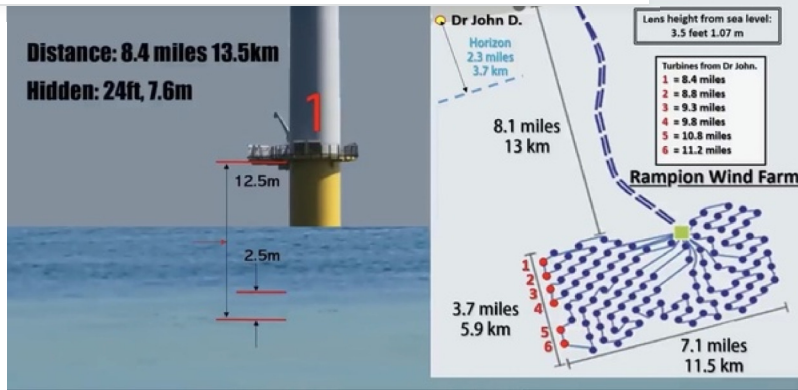

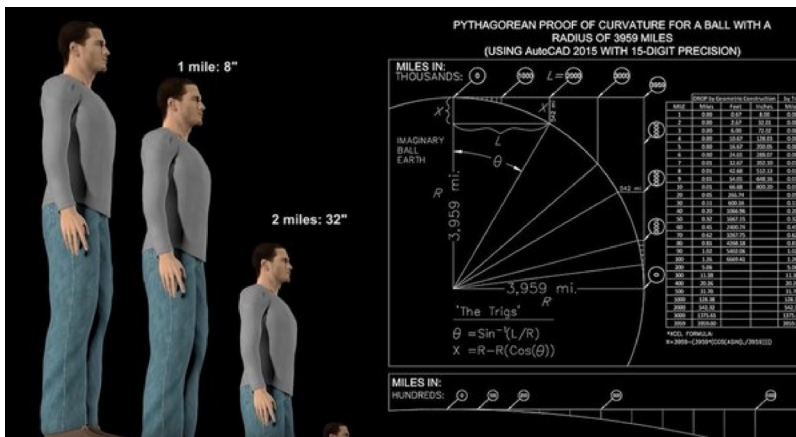


Here is what the globe model predicts for the 6 windmills lined up in a row along 5.9km starting at 13km out:

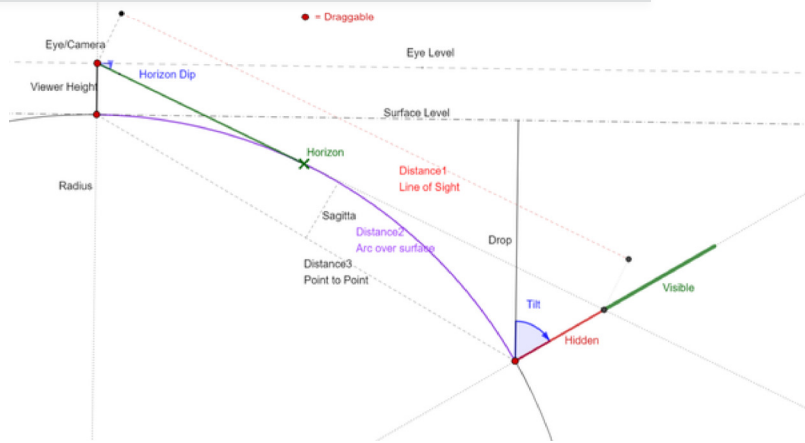




So here's the principle "globe science" uses to make predictions:



... and here's the geometry curvature calculators incorporating the viewer's elevation use to make predictions:



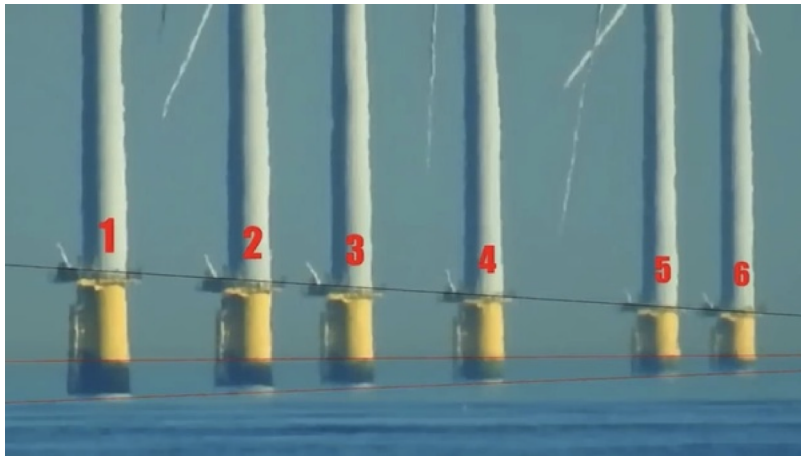
Now let's see what the "factual evidence" tells us:



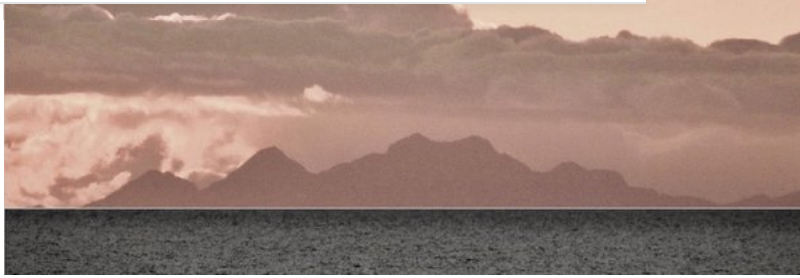
Absolutely zero part of the structures is lost to curvature, even the reflection of the landing platform in the water immediately surrounding the contact of structure and water is visible.

The theory of a flat plane optically following the rules of perspective makes the right prediction:



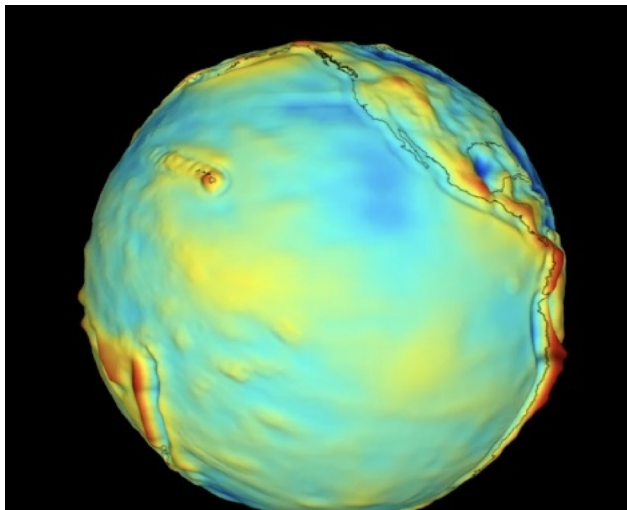
Another example of failed prediction: this is what the globe theory predicts would be visible from the coast of Italy seen from across the Adriatic:



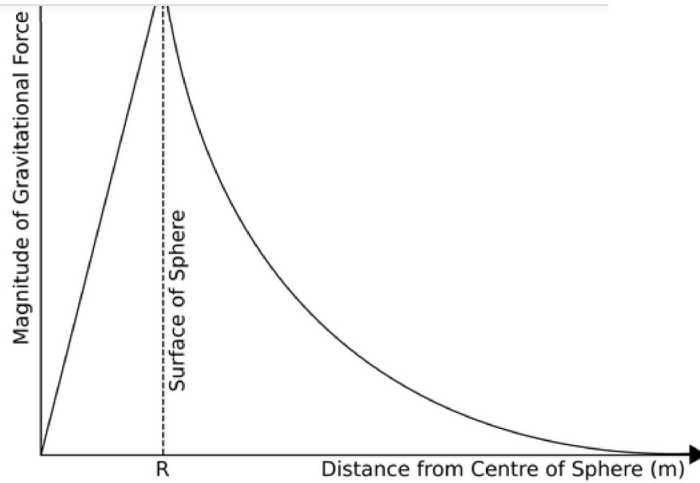
... and this is what is actually visible:



But this is not denying science, this is denying visual evidence: denying science is this: we know that freely rotating objects which can dissipate energy by way of a liquid or semi liquid interior orient themselves - that is, their rotational axis - along a maximum momentum/minimum energy axis, which in case of a rotating earth would mean a rotational axis going through the Pacific with the continents lined up along the equator - which is obviously not the case:

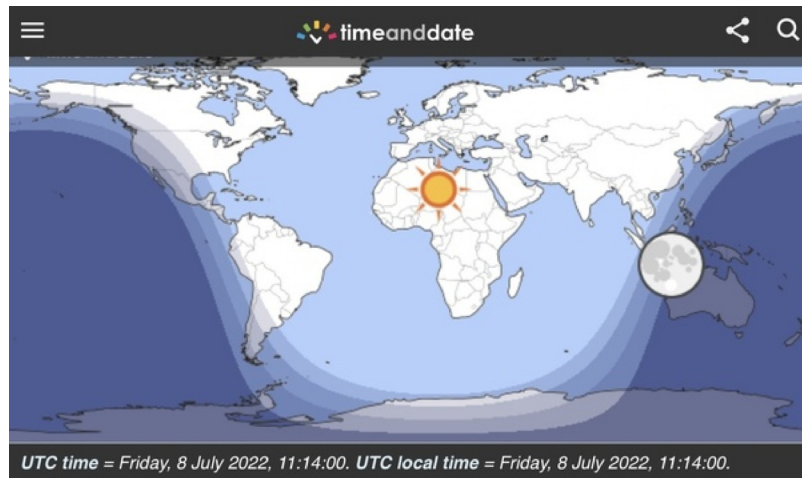

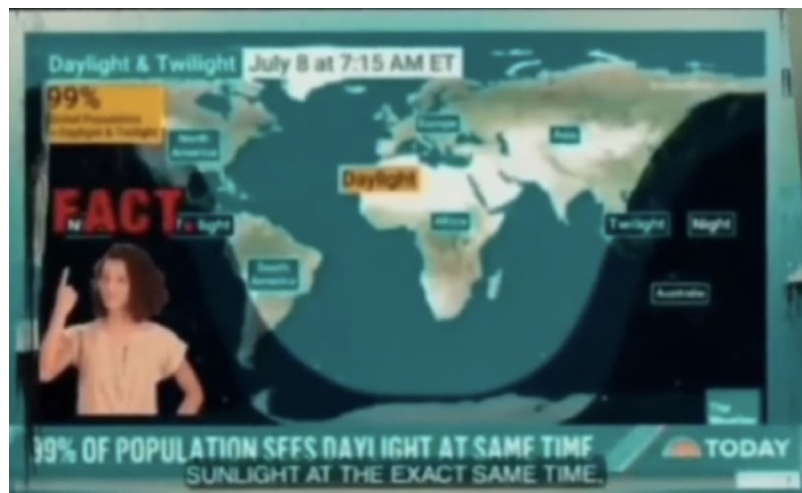


Bottomline: there is no support for a globe theory, neither visual nor theoretical!

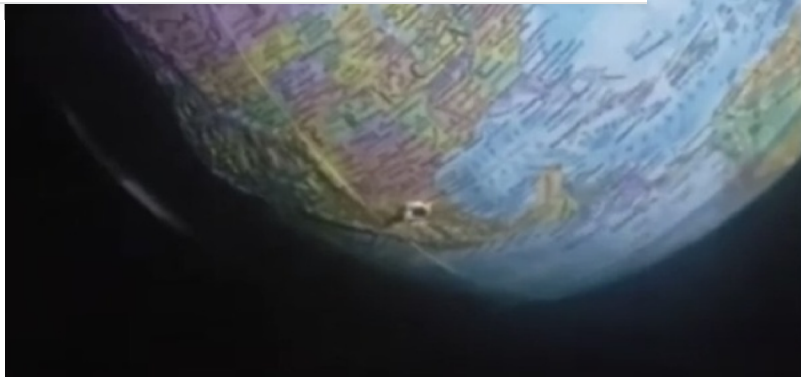
PS.: there are incorrect predictions, but there are also correct predictions made for the wrong model: here a daylight map showing 95% of humanity receiving daylight or twilight,

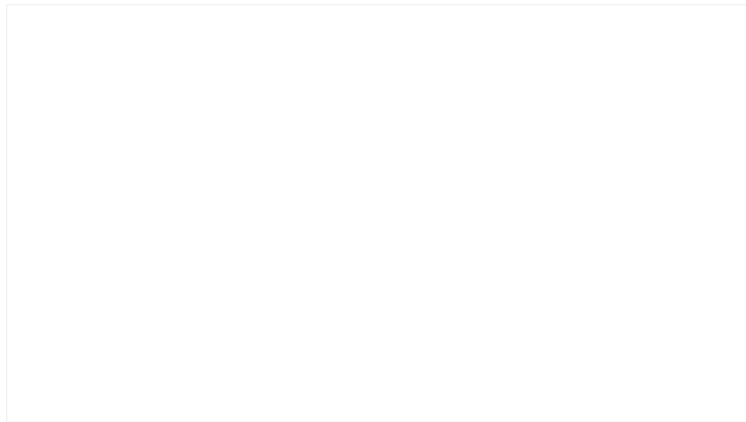
